## Informal WTO Ministerial Gathering Davos, 23 January 2016

## Personal Concluding Remarks by the Chair, State Secretary Marie-Gabrielle Ineichen-Fleisch, Switzerland

In concluding this Informal WTO Ministerial Gathering, and in my personal capacity, I would like to highlight the following points based on our discussion:

- Deep appreciation to the Government and people of Kenya for the excellent organisation and warm hospitality during the 10<sup>th</sup> WTO Ministerial Conference (MC10), held in December 2015 in Nairobi, to the MC10 Chair, Cabinet Secretary Amina Mohamed, for her outstanding commitment and guidance, and to WTO Director-General Roberto Azevêdo and his team for the tireless efforts before and at MC10;
- Emphasis on the role of trade as an engine for growth and development;
- Importance of the substantive, multilaterally-negotiated outcomes achieved both at MC10 and the 9<sup>th</sup> WTO Ministerial Conference held in 2013 in Bali;
- Importance of fully implementing the decisions taken in Bali and Nairobi;
- Importance of maintaining the WTO's negotiating function operational and
  of delivering further negotiated outcomes in the coming years, with a focus
  on unfinished business but also allowing for discussions on other issues that
  Members would like to raise.
- Need for open-minded and pragmatic approaches as well as flexibility in the work ahead;
- Centrality of development and need for inclusiveness in the discussions.
- Need for strong political engagement to back the process in Geneva.
