

List of appliances subject to the ORDEE (Art. 2 Para. 3) / as of January 2005

The appliances given in the list below as part of the individual appliance categories should be understood as examples. This is therefore not an exhaustive list. Appliances in the list below, insofar as they are operated using electrical energy, are subject to the provisions of the ORDEE.

Refrigeration	<p>Refrigerators and freezers, air-conditioning equipment, ice machines</p>
Large household appliances	<p>Dishwashers, ovens, cookers, microwave cookers, washing machines, tumble dryers, carpet cleaning devices, knitting machines, ironing machines, electrical grills, oil radiators</p>
Small household appliances	<p>Raclette ovens, toasters, coffee machines, food mixers, kneading machines, meat mincers, juice pressers, bread baking machines, hairdryers, electric toothbrushes, shavers, hair removal devices, electric scales, fan heaters, ventilators, solariums, sewing machines, irons, salon hairdryers, vacuum cleaners, electric air fresheners</p>

List of appliances not subject to the ORDEE / as of January 2005

Like all types of waste, electrical and electronic appliances must also be disposed of in an environmentally sound way, regardless of whether they are subject to the ORDEE or not. The Fact sheets on the state of the art for electronics scrap disposal can therefore serve as standards for such disposal. The inclusion of appliances in this list signifies that they are not subject to the duty to return or to take them back under the ORDEE, that no disposal permit under Article 7 ORDEE is necessary for their treatment, and that their export does not come under the provisions of Article 9 ORDEE. For export, other international regulations are of course reserved. If appliances in this list are taken back by manufacturers, importers or dealers, this is done on a voluntary basis.

Appliance category	Examples
Industrial electronics	Lathes, tool machines, industrial machines (looms etc.), UPS (uninterruptible power supplies)
Telecommunications	Telephone exchanges, aerials, large broadcasting installations
Laboratory and measuring equipment	Blood pressure monitors, chemical and medical analytical equipment
Household technology	Boilers, central heating systems (including oil burners), built-in air-conditioners, heat pumps, industrial and large cooling installations
Accessories	Toner modules, print cartridges, typewriter ribbons, printer paper, transparencies, film or photographic materials, data carriers (magnetic tapes, floppy discs, CD, DVD), sound carriers (cassettes, magnetic tapes, LPs)
Vehicles, aircraft, ships	All electrical and electronic components of all kinds of vehicles (lorries, cars, motorcycles, scooters, bicycles, electrical vehicles, ships, aircraft etc.), including still built-in car radios or CD players etc.
